



NTIS FedWorld

The goal of NTIS FedWorld is to provide a one-stop location for the public to locate, order and have delivered to them, U.S. Government information. FedWorld got its start in November of 1992 when the National Technical Information Service (NTIS), an agency of the U.S. Department of Commerce, started a small dial-up access system that allowed users to connect to about 50 other Government bulletin boards, as well as get information on the different Government information products available from NTIS. Today, the FedWorld Information Network consists of an integrated network offering the public broad access to information including the World Wide Web, 20 searchable databases, an FTP, and Bulletin Board system, and fee based services. It is a comprehensive central access point for searching, locating, ordering and acquiring government and business information.
