The new postdoc will work in collaboration with Jason Fletcher, Alberto Palloni, Michal Engelman, and several other UW-Madison faculty on a multi-year research project funded by the National Institute on Aging. The appointment can start as early as January 1, 2019, but start dates through September 1, 2019 are possible.
