Patients' Conceptions of Terms Related to Sexual Interest, Desire, and Arousal. John D. DeLamater, Kevin P. Weinfurt, Kathryn E. Flynn. *Journal of Sexual Medicine*.

Objective: To inform self-reported measurement efforts for both research and clinical settings by examining how U.S. men and women understand and interpret terms including (sexual) interest, desire, and arousal.

Methods: We present data from 10 focus groups with patients recruited in Durham, NC (N=57). Discussion guides included questions about the meaning and connotation of multiple terms related to libido. Discussions were audio recorded and transcribed, and the content of the discussions was analyzed for major themes by two independent coders with all coding discrepancies resolved through discussion with a third coder.

Results: Five of the groups included male participants and five included female participants; participants were also diverse with respect to age, race, and health. Participants characterized (sexual) interest as a cognitive phenomenon and a situational response to a specific person. Similarly, they characterized (sexual) desire as a situational, person-specific experience with some support for it as a cognitive phenomenon but more support for it as a physical phenomenon. In contrast, participants characterized sexual arousal as a physical phenomenon, occurring in response to physical or visual stimulation and not related to a specific person.

Conclusion: Among a diverse sample of U.S. men and women, the terms interest, desire, and arousal were defined, compared, and contrasted. Qualitative coding revealed that interest was considered the most “cognitive”, arousal the most “physical”, and desire somewhere in between. These results can help us understand how lay people are using and responding to these terms when they are used in clinical and research settings.

Research projects employing representative samples have provided data about the sexual expression of older adults in the past decade. The results indicate that sexual activity declines with age. Most of the data are quantitative. The purpose of this research was to study the lived experience of women 55 to 80. We ask: how does women’s sexuality change in later life, and how do women experience these changes? Face-to-face interviews were conducted with 24 women 55 to 80; all self-identified as heterosexual. With regard to change, most of the women reported declining sexual desire in the recent past; some attributed it to feeling less attractive or “frumpy”, others to physical changes which made sexual activity uncomfortable, and others to partners’ health problems. Paradoxically, only a minority reported declining frequency of sexual activity, while others reported stable frequencies, citing the importance of sex to the relationship. A minority reported increased frequency, in some cases associated with entering a new relationship. Most women reported exercising agency and initiating changes designed to maintain or enhance sexual expression as they aged. Our results provide valuable insights into older women’s experiences of change in sexuality, and their use of agency to cope with these changes.

Who can we talk to? Communication about sexuality in later life. With Erica Koepsel and Taylor Johnson. Submitted to *Sex and Marital Therapy*.

Several large-scale research projects employing representative or community samples have provided important information about the sexual expression of older adults in the past decade. Most of the data is quantitative in nature. The purpose of this research was to study the lived experience of women 55 to 80. We ask: does communication play a role in women's adjustment to changing sexuality in later life, and, if so, how and to whom do women communicate about these changes? Face-to-face interviews were conducted with 24 women; all self-identified as heterosexual. Most of the women reported communicating about sexuality with at least one significant person in their lives, such as a primary partner, family member, friend, or a professional (such as a therapist, counselor, doctor, or other health care professional). A small number claimed that they spoke with no one about sexuality, but all expressed the desire to communicate. Some barriers to communication were the avoidance of specific topics, the woman's own reticence, problems with sexual functioning, and the potential audience. Some facilitators to communication were the perceived importance of sex, access to a sexual partner, problems in a relationship, and again, the potential audience. For multiple women, our study was one of the only forums they had to discuss their experiences with sexuality in later life. Our results provide valuable insights into older women's experiences of communication about sexuality.

RESEARCH IN PROGRESS

1. **Sexuality Across the Life Course.**

This project is concerned with the impact of normative life transitions on sexual attitudes and behavior. According to the life course perspective, involvement in a specific life stage should be associated with relative stability in relevant attitudes and behavior. Movement through normative life transitions should be associated with change in relevant attitudes and behavior. These general hypotheses should apply to sexual attitudes and behavior. The norms associated with some transitions, for example marriage/entry into a committed relationship, require changes in sexual behavior. Other transitions, such as adolescence (the transition associated with the biological events of puberty), create the potential for changes in sexual attitudes and behavior but do not prescribe change. Passage through a transition may affect the person by changing 1) the person's characteristics -- attitudes, skills, self-image, or 2) the reactions of others to the person.

The transitions of interest include:

- 1) adolescence (puberty);
- 2) sexual initiation/transition to nonvirginity;
- 3) establishing a committed/living together/marital relationship;
- 4) giving birth to/adopting a child;
- 5) terminating a long-term relationship/separation/divorce;

- 6) widowhood;
- 7) menopause/midlife.

Thirteen papers related to this project have been published: Eleven were blind peer reviewed, and include two papers in *Journal of Marriage and Family* and one in *Journal of Gerontology, Social Sciences*.

A conceptual framework for this program is presented in Carpenter and DeLamater, "Studying Gendered Sexualities over the Life Course: A Conceptual Framework," in *Sex for Life*, NYU Press, 2012, 23-41. At present I am analyzing data from the National Social Life, Health, and Aging Project (Laumann, et al.) to determine the effects of a variety of hormonal, psychological and social influences on sexual desire and behavior among older persons.

2. Overreporting of Socially Desirable Behaviors

Summary: We proposed research to assess the effects of mode of collection on the quality of survey self-reports of health. The two modes are:

- 1) Conventional web survey, using the same instrument as the CATI;
- 2) Experimental; pre-measure CATI to collect demographic and general health measures; on five specific days during a two-week period respondent asked to report each time s/he begins a major activity. Reports submitted via text message. Respondents who have not reported in 90 minutes will be prompted by text message.

Self-reported health measures included overall health, and measures of physical activity including recreation and exercise. We will also collect data on height and weight, allowing calculation of BMI, and measures of identity which we predict will be associated with self-report.

Criterion: The criterion to which we compared the self-reports is a reverse-record check of entrance to on-campus recreational sports and athletic facilities. Admission is via swiped electronic ID; the available data includes student ID number and time and date of swipe.

We have collected two rounds of data, in 2011 and 2014. Three papers have been published reporting the results.
