



Menzie D. Chinn is Professor of Public Affairs and Economics at the University of Wisconsin's Robert M. La Follette School of Public Affairs. His research is focused on international finance and macroeconomics. He is currently a co-editor of the *Journal of International Money and Finance*, an associate editor of the *Journal of Money, Credit and Banking*, and formerly an associate editor of the *Journal of International Economics* and *Review of International Economics*.

In 2000-2001, Professor Chinn served as Senior Staff Economist for International Finance on the President's Council of Economic Advisers. He is currently a Research Associate in the International Finance and Macroeconomics Program of the National Bureau of Economic Research, and has been a visiting scholar at the International Monetary Fund, the Congressional Budget Office, the Federal Reserve Board and the European Central Bank. He currently serves on the CBO Panel of Economic Advisers.

He is coauthor (with Jeffrey Frieden) of *Lost Decades: The Making of America's Debt Crisis and the Long Recovery* (2011, W.W. Norton), and contributor to *Econbrowser*, a weblog devoted to current macroeconomic issues.

Prior to his appointment at the University of Wisconsin–Madison in 2003, Professor Chinn taught at the University of California, Santa Cruz. He received his doctorate in Economics from the University of California, Berkeley, and his AB from Harvard University.
